



**Larsen Pavilion Resident Council Meeting,
Notes from September 3, 2009**

**Attendance: Pavilion staff, Dietary service and Auxiliary.

Linda Hicks, Activities Staff Member chaired the meeting.**

Sherry Brown, Director of Long Term Care:

- Sherry mentioned that the new stained glass doors have been installed in the Chapel. They were donated by the benefactor of the Chapel.

Marjorie Pregent, Director of Nursing:

- Margie informed the residents that the call light monitoring system was working very well. She stated that call lights had gone off 11,223 times during the month. She also said that the Nursing staff was hoping call lights would be answered in 3 – 5 minutes but the average time was 1 min 43 seconds. Margie said this would be monitored weekly.
- Flu vaccines will be starting in September instead of October this year and employees would be given their shots first.
- Margie also informed the residents that a DVD could be shown to them to explain the flu signs and symptoms to them.
- If residents come down with the flu, they will be kept in their room and visitors will be asked not to come in. This will be monitored floor by floor and items such as masks, gels and reminders about hand washing will be reinforced. Shell Point is in contact with the Lee County Health Department and we will know when any of these flu outbreaks occur.

Abby Rosman, Resident and Family Services Coordinator:

- Discussed with residents the reasons for the Resident Council meetings. She explained that it is an opportunity to share information, find out what is new, what's planned, things that have changed, and concerns residents may have.
- Questions included how the construction project was coming on the first floor. Sherry informed the group that when the project funds were in hand that the construction would then begin.
